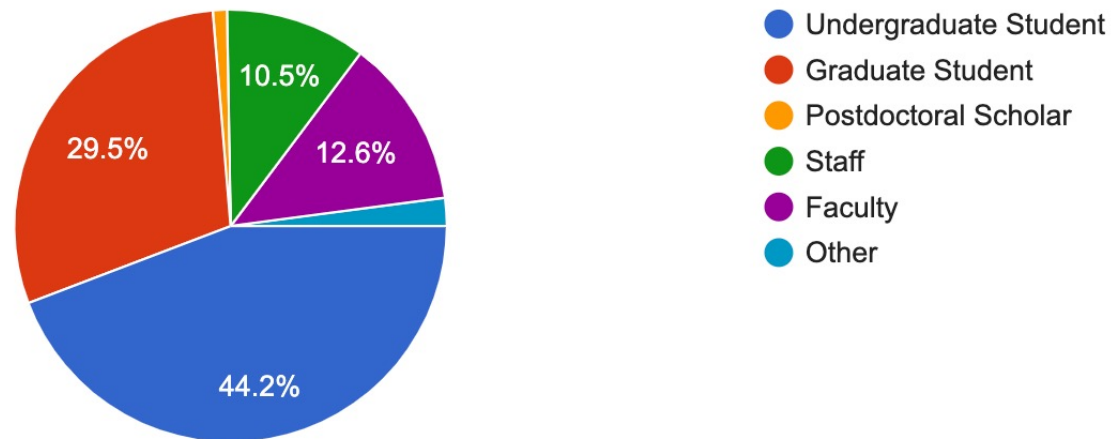

Which of these options in the previous question best describes your role in CEE: undergrad student, grad student, postdoc, staff, faculty, other (if “other”, please describe in the next question)?

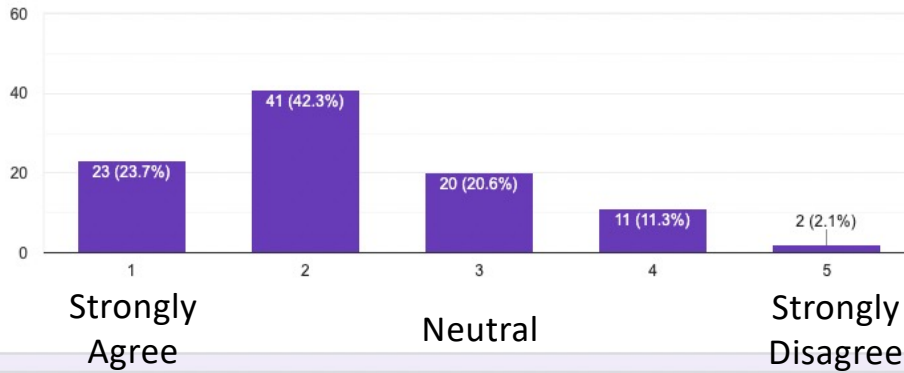

Overall, I am comfortable with the climate in CEE.

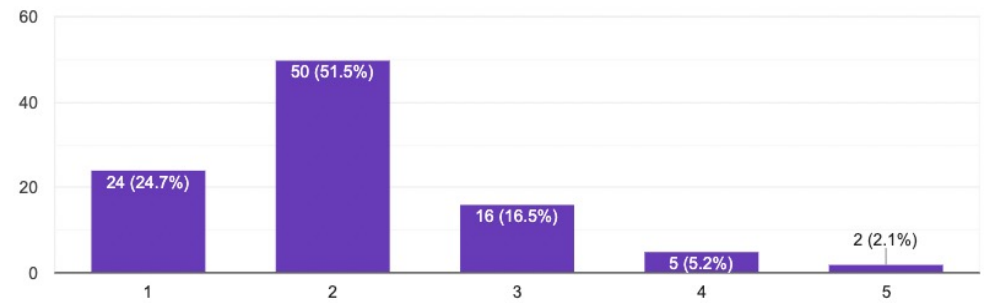

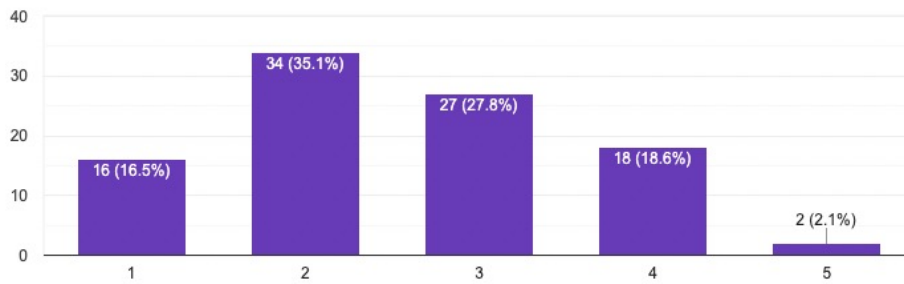
Students help each other succeed in CEE.

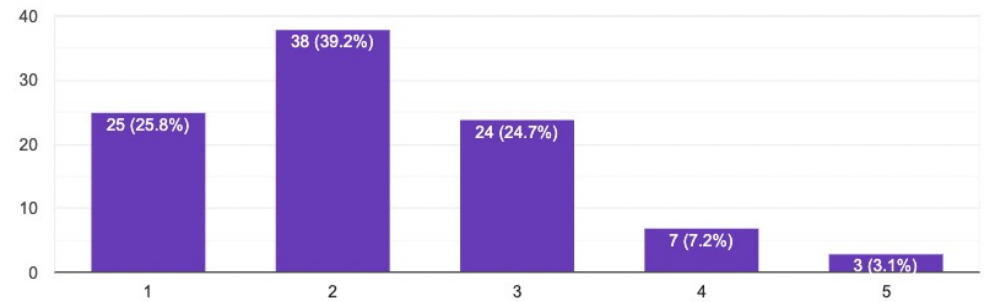

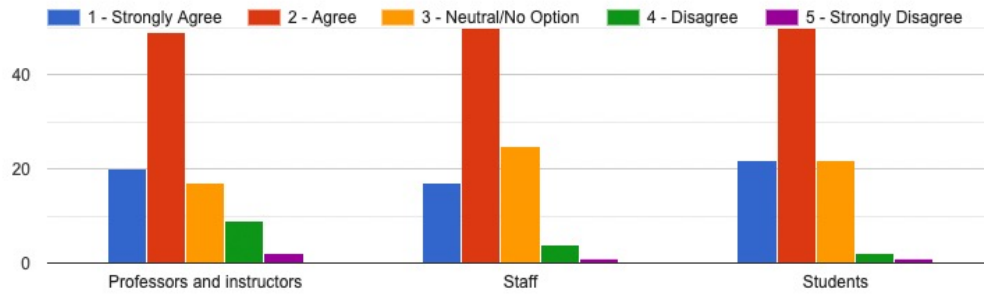

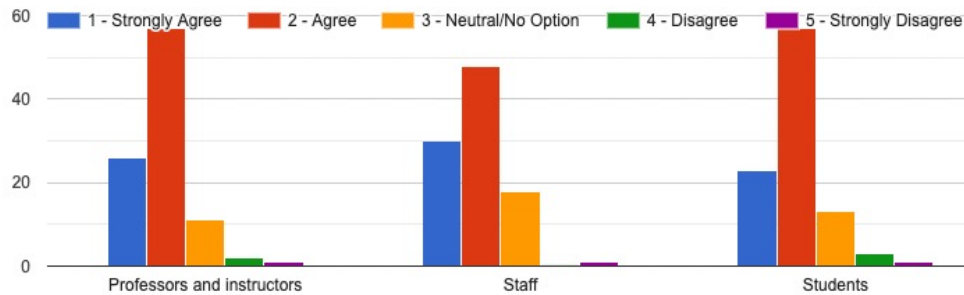
